Introduction

The **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association** has been established in Hong Kong for 133 years. It was first started in 1884 and inaugurated in 1900. The **Brigade**, the service arm of the Organization, was formally established in 1916 during World War I, followed by the establishment of the **Council** in 1949. Ever since then, St. John in Hong Kong has been active in the provision of First Aid training and allied services to the public.

The principle and spirit of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance as embodies in the motto “**For the Service of Mankind**” remain unchanged after the enactment of the new **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Incorporation Ordinance (Chapter 1164)** on 27 June 1997. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance continues in promoting and encouraging all works of humanity and charity for the relief of distress, suffering, sickness and danger without any distinction as to race, class or creed.

The **Council** is the supreme governing body of **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance** and is charged with the governance, management and control of all business and activities of the Corporation. The Council is composed of dedicated volunteers from various professions and the Assistant Director (Administration and Policy) of Department of Health also sits on the Council as Observer. The Council’s work is facilitated by its Sub-Committees, namely Two MacDonnell Road Management, the Finance, the Honours and Awards, the Medical, the Public Relations, the Property Management and Development, the Greater China Affairs and the Ambulance Service Steering Committees.

The **Association**, the training arm of the organization, is the premier organization throughout the territory for the instruction of the public in the principles and practice of First Aid, Home Nursing and allied subjects to members of the general public in Hong Kong since 1884. The **Director’s Conference** is responsible for ensuring the training works of the Association are conducted effectively and efficiently. There are 530 volunteer lecturers, including doctors and nurses.

The **Brigade** is responsible for the organization, training and equipment of adult and youth to undertake, on a voluntary basis, either as individuals or as organized groups, First Aid, Home Nursing and allied activities in public places, places of employment or work, or elsewhere as occasions may require, for the welfare to those in need. The service is free. The **Commissioner’s Conference** is responsible for the organization, administration, provision of services and development of the Brigade. At present, there are 7,258 members, made up of 3,567 adult and 3,691 Youth members including 202 members from St. John Pandas.

Chairman's Report

2016-2017 was a year with special meaning to the organization and also to me. It marked the Brigade Centenary year for providing service in Hong Kong. St. John is always dedicated to serve and respond to the needs of local community. 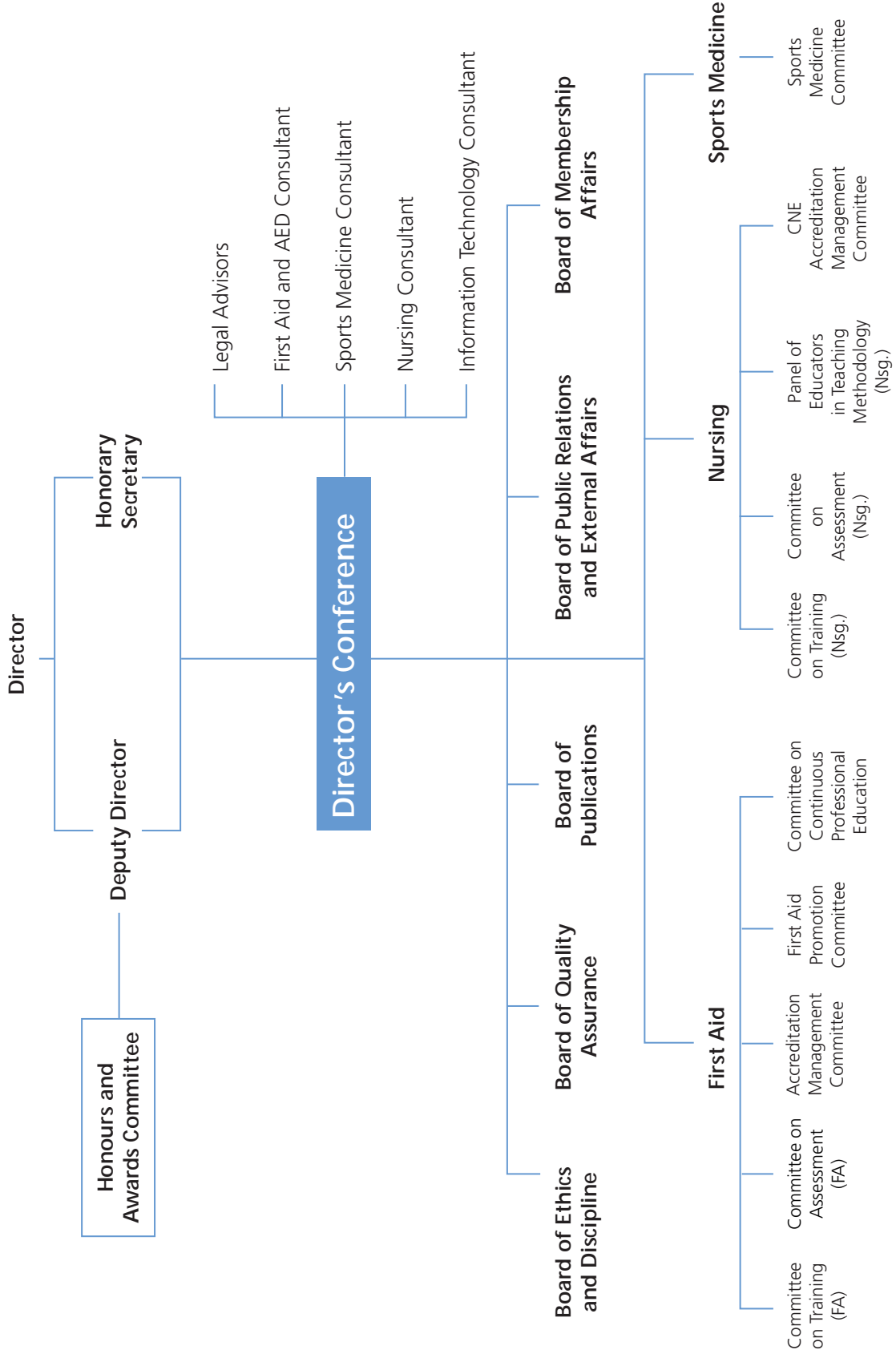

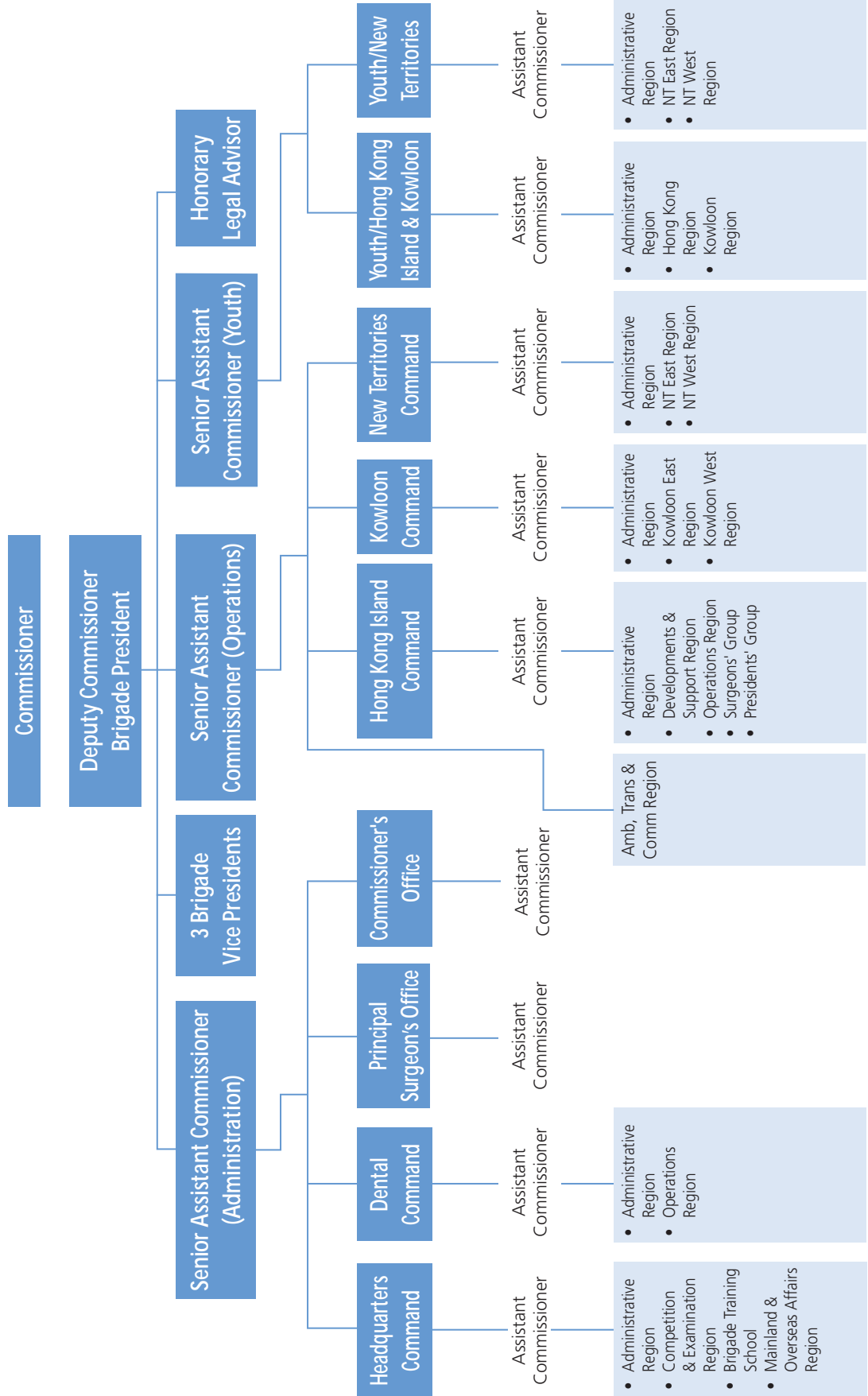

The Guangzhou Medical Association invited Council Chairman, Dr. David Mok Lai-foo and Association Director, Dr. Chung Chin-hung to lead a delegation to a 2-day **Guangzhou Exchange Tour** on 28 and 29 January 2016 for the promotion of Guangdong-Hong Kong cooperation on PHTLS provider course, personnel training and research.

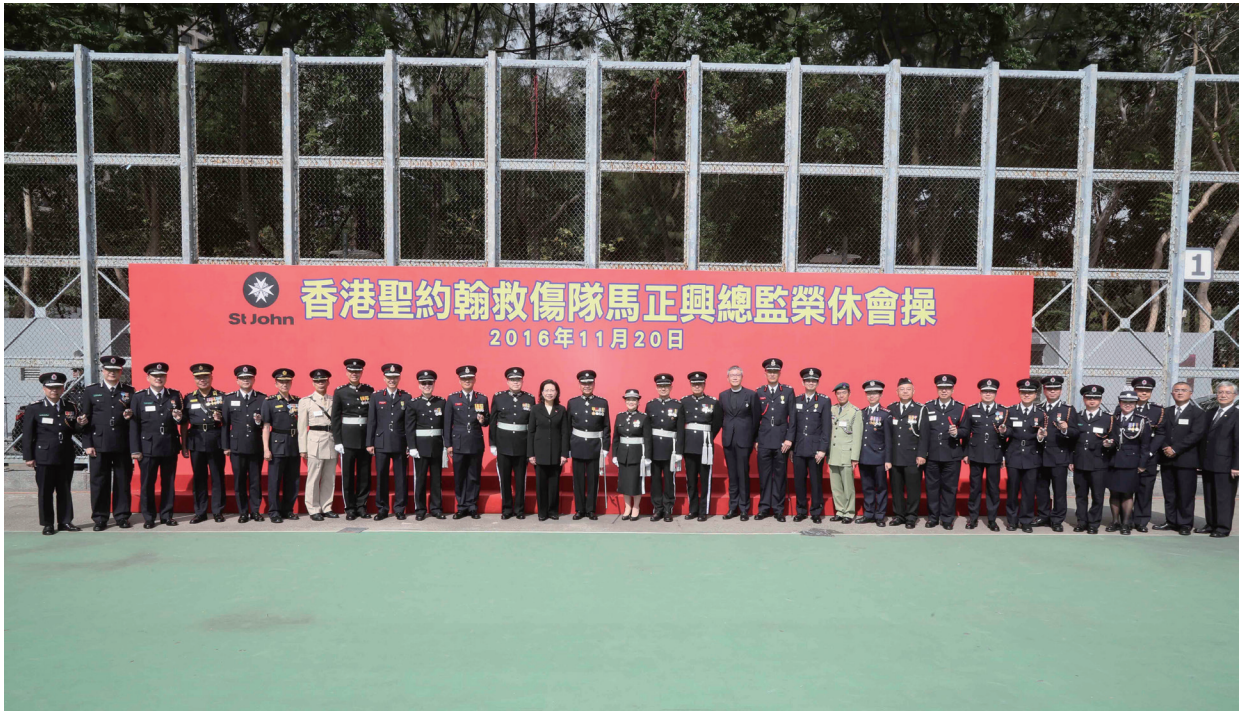
A seminar on medical emergency was held on the first day. Dr. Mok introduced the work of St. John to the representatives of Guangzhou Medical Association, while Dr. Chung highlighted the first aid training organized by St. John Ambulance Association. Guangzhou Medical Association also introduced their workflow process of PHTLS and first aid training to St. John.



5. The **Annual Parade of Brigade** was held at Victoria Park, Causeway Bay on Sunday, 20 November 2016. This was also the Farewell Parade held in the honor of the Commissioner, Dr. Stanley Ma Ching-hing.

Dr. Ma first joined the Brigade in 1977 as a Divisional Surgeon of Manshuen Nursing Division. Since then, Dr. Ma has served the organization for 40 years. Dr. Ma retired on 24 November 2016. His dedication to promote the services of the Brigade to the local community as well as in the Mainland is notable.





6. A visit to Peking University Shenzhen Hospitals led by Association Director, Dr. Chung Ching-hung with 32 Association members was held on Saturday, 25 June 2016. Participants got first hand information on the development strategies and scope of service of the hospital. The team was impressed by the advance medical devices of the Intensive Care Unit and Emergency Room.



7. To support Food and Health Bureau in promoting organ donation to members of the public, **Organ Donation - Save Life and Emergency Care Exhibition** was held on Saturday, 15 October 2016 at Wah Fu (I) Estate Commercial Complex Open Ground. Professor Sophia Chan Siu-Chee, JP, Under Secretary for Food and Health was invited as the Officiating Guest.



8. Adhering to the international standard, the Association published a new edition of “**First Aid Manual**” on Friday, 9 September 2016. Parallel update seminars were held on Thursday, 5 May and Wednesday, 11 May 2016 at St. John Tower for St. John Lecturers and Instructors in this regard. Association Director, Dr. Chung Chin-hung has introduced the updated knowledge, while the Chairman of Board of Publications of the Association, Dr. Chau Chi-wai has introduced the updated content published in the First Aid Manual.



9. The **Annual Awards Presentation Ceremony** of Association was held on Saturday, 5 November 2016 at Maxim's Palace Chinese Restaurant. Around 300 St. John Lecturers/Instructors and guests attended the ceremony. Mr. Eddie Ng Hak-kim, SBS, JP, Secretary for Education was invited as the Officiating Guest.



10. The **Lunar New Year Spring Reception** was held on Monday, 6 February 2017 at Aw Boon Hwa Hall, St. John Tower. Over 250 guests including Officers from Government Bureaus and Departments, Members of the Legislative Council, Representatives from the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government, Heads of Uniformed Groups and schools attended the reception.



11. The **Secretary for Home Affairs' (SHA) Commendation Scheme** aims at giving recognition to special achievements of individual volunteer leaders of each Uniformed Groups under the purview of SHA in youth development works.

Superintendent Chan Siu-ming and Superintendent Chiu Ho-lam of Youth Command were awarded with the Volunteer Leader Commendation. While Ambulance Officer So Yan-chi and Ambulance Officer Yeung Man-chung were awarded with the Youth Volunteer Leader Commendation in recognition of their outstanding and continuous contribution in youth works through the St. John Youth Command. The Presentation Ceremony was held on Wednesday, 30 November 2016 at Youth Square.



Service Reports

1. During the reporting year, the Brigade discharged a total of 330,489 man-hours of volunteer first aid, ambulance duties, dental and community services for the public.
2. In 2016/2017, the Brigade responded to 7,512 emergency and non-emergency calls for ambulance services. A detailed breakdown of these calls is tabulated below for easy reference.

3. Dental Service

Dental service provided by Hong Kong St John Ambulance Brigade has been in operation for over 66 years. This is the only service provided among the global St. John Ambulance Brigade.

Free dental service is made available to the elderly and patients with special needs by Brigade volunteer dental surgeons, dental surgery assistants and members at the Dental Clinic located at the St. John Headquarters or to the elderly homes by the Outreach Team. In addition, oral health services are provided to the public through campaigns and special events.

In 2016/2017, volunteers in Dental Command provided dental services to a total of 1,335 patients. 2,716 cases were treated in the dental clinic, 5,594 members of public received free consultations and oral examinations through various health promotional projects and a total of 2,475 patients, majority of whom were having various degree of intellectual disability, received free basic dental treatment, include oral examination, dental prophylaxis, fillings and extractions.

“Special Smile” Project 2015-2017 (笑容重現行動)

The Community Chest of Hong Kong sponsored over HK\$3 million for provision of free dental service to children and young persons under 21-year old who live in Small Group Homes, Boy’s and Girl’s Home or Children’s Home and pre-school children aged 2 to 6 who receive care and/or education in the Special Needs Education (SEN) Centres or Kindergartens. From April 2016 to March 2017, there were 1,991 patients with 2,122 cases being treated under the project. The feedbacks were very positive and overwhelming.



Trainings

For the Public/Organizations

1. Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO)

ALSO provider courses were jointly organized by the Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine and the Hong Kong College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists for the seventh consecutive years at St. John Tower. Three ALSO courses were conducted on 12-13 April, 14-15 April and 18-19 April 2016 at St. John Tower with over 100 nurses and doctors participated.



2. Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) Course

The Association has launched a new course, namely Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) Course. The first AMLS course, developed by NAEMT and implemented by St. John was conducted on 28 and 29 April 2016 with 29 participants mainly doctors and nurses. Apart from the theoretical aspects, interactive simulations and problem solving scenarios have given participants realistic exposure to similar cases.

A couple of AMLS Courses were conducted on 16-17 June 2016 and 7-8 July 2016 respectively for medical students, doctors and nurses. The first course opened to the public was delivered on 2 and 9 September 2016.



3. Free Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Training Courses for Members of the Public

The Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund has granted the Association funding for conducting free 6-hour CPR & AED training for members of the public. The project was conducted from 3 May 2016 to 14 September 2016 with 1,945 participants attended.

4. MTR First Aid Competition 2016

Since 2012, MTR has invited the Association to organize a First Aid Competition to enhance the level of competence of MTR staffs in emergency situations. In 2016, the competition was conducted on 17 May 2016 at Fo Tan MTR Depot. An Emergency Physician, Dr. Chau Chi-wai and an Assistant Training Manager led a team of eight to act as judges in the competition. 24 teams, each with 3 members, participated in the competition by applying first aid skills in designated scenarios and timeframe. The scenario for 2016 was fire outbreak on MTR train, the MTR teams were tested in the handling of injuries and emergency situations.



5. Stroke Care Course

Board of Membership Affairs invited the Social Services Department of Sik Sik Yuen to send a group of elderly carers to attend the first Stroke Care Course conducted on 6, 13, 20, 26 and 27 July 2016. 16 candidates were trained for 36 hours with comprehensive theory and practical sessions. The participants commented that they had more understanding of the procedures that have applied on the elderly and they enjoyed very much the practical sessions.



6. Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Education Project of Rotary

With the sponsorship of Rotary International District 3450, the first course was conducted from 20 September 2016 to 21 January 2017 with a total of 1,669 members of the public including members of Rotary were trained.

Professor Sophia Chan Siu-chee, JP, Under Secretary for Food and Health was invited to officiate at the press conference and opening Ceremony on Saturday, 10 September 2016 at St. John Tower. Council Chairman, Dr. David Mok Lai-foo and Association Director, Dr. Chung Chin-hung were invited to attend the event.



7. First Aid and AED Course for the Hong Kong Jockey Club Public Riding School in Guangzhou Huangcun

A first aid and AED course was organized for the Hong Kong Jockey Club Public Riding School built in Guangzhou Huangcun on 27 and 28 September 2016. The training was tailor-made for the riding school with specific first aid theory in wound cares, fractures, sprains, cramps etc. The training also included CPR and AED. After training, the students are expected to handle emergency situations even when somebody fell from horse. The Association will send Lecturers to Huangcun on request.



8. Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Courses

The Association has become the sole provider of PHTLS courses in Hong Kong since 2002. The course was developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States and was introduced to Hong Kong by the China-Hong Kong Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. This two-day intensive course gives instructions on kinematics of injuries, assessment and management of trauma patients with multiple injuries. Prospective trainees include doctors, nurses and pre-hospital care providers.

Training for Health Care professionals from the Mainland and Taiwan was held on 29-30 September 2016 with doctors, nurses from Guangzhou Emergency and 6 Emergency Medical Technicians from Formosa Association of Emergency Medicine Education Taiwan participated in the PHTLS Course held in Hong Kong.

11 doctors and nurses from Guangzhou Emergency Center came to Hong Kong and participated in the PHTLS course from 6 to 8 June 2016. And 14 doctors and nurses attended the PHTLS course on 16-17 February 2017.



A PHTLS course was conducted for Formosa Association of Emergency Medicine Education, Taiwan on 7-8 January 2017 with 20 participants.



For Lecturers/Officers and Members

1. First Aid Lecturer Training Course (LTC) 14/15

8 lecturer trainees completed the LTC and graduated in November 2016.

2. Continuous Professional Education Programme

A compulsory Continuous Professional Education (CPE) programme has been established for all First Aid Lecturers since July 2005 to encourage life-long learning and holistic development. 9 CPE points were assigned for a total of 3 seminars in the year 2016/2017 with topics in First Aid and Health issues, as exemplified by 「下腰痛症：術前、術後的物理治療處理？」、「災害與公共衛生應對」、「基本心電圖之認識及剖析危急心律不齊之常見心電圖」。

3. Continuous Nursing Education

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance is appointed as a provider of Continuing Nursing Education (CNE). The CNE Accreditation Management Committee of the Association is accountable for defining and approving CNE credit point(s) for each St. John programme. In 2016, 4.5 CNE points were allocated to two seminars of 「預防跌倒」 and 「愛嬰社區 Baby Friendly Community」 and to those CPE seminars listed above.

4. Two Workshops on Future Recruitment Strategy and Training of the Brigade

Two workshops were held on Sunday, 12 February 2017 (for Junior Officers and Members) and on Sunday, 5 March 2017 (for Senior Officers and Section Heads) respectively. There were about 80 attendees for each workshop. Constructive and useful feedbacks were collected at the workshops.



For Mainland

1. Organized the Training Course with Sanhe Emergency Centre (三河市急救中心) from 19-23 April 2016 in Sanhe, Hebei Province.
2. Organized the Training Course for Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region Hulun Buir Emergency Centre & Hulun Buir Hospital (呼倫貝爾 120 醫療急救指揮中心、滿洲里市人民醫院) from 19-24 July 2016 in Inner Mongolia.
3. Jointly organized the Training Course with Wuxi Emergency Centre (無錫急救中心) from 30 November to 2 December 2016 in Wuxi.
4. Jointly organized the Training Course with Langfang 120 Emergency Centre (廊坊市急救中心) from 20-24 March 2017 in Langfang, Hebei Province.

Training and activities for Cadets and Adult members of the Brigade personnel & Youth Command were organized separately by the Youth Command with the support from Headquarters staff. A summary of the trainings is listed as below:

Special Programs

1. As an initiative to promote national education, young people are given the opportunity to conduct **Flag-Raising Ceremony at Golden Bauhinia Square**. Youths participating in this program were recommended by leaders from various Uniformed Groups and have received specialized training for conducting the ceremony at Golden Bauhinia Square. The Scheme was conducted on the second Sunday of each month since 2008 and St. John Cadets were responsible for the flag-raising on Wednesday, 17 August 2016.



2. **HK Uniformed Groups 10,000 Miles Friendship Trek** is a cultural exchange program jointly organized by Hong Kong Uniformed Youth Groups and Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR. Participants of the program are youth members from all Uniformed Groups in Hong Kong. 2 Officers and 22 Cadet Members of Youth Command joined the 10-day exchange program from 22 to 31 July 2016. The group attended the Flag Raising Ceremony at the People's Square, Beijing.



3. One Belt One Road Hong Kong Malaysia Exchange Program

To promote communication and cultural exchange between the youth and the counterparts in the Belt and Road countries with an aim to achieve the target of fostering “people-to-people bond”, Youth Command organized the Exchange Program with Malaysia St. John from 24 to 28 August 2016. 2 Officers and 14 Cadet Members from Youth Command joined the 5-day exchange program in Malaysia to enhance our Cadet Members to better understand their academic studies, career and personal development to the future development of Hong Kong which are all closely related issues to our country's Belt and Road Initiatives.



4. Social Welfare Activities

The Board of Membership Affairs of the Association organized an activity jointly with Wong Tai Sin District Council, Wong Tai Sin District Healthy & Safe City and Sik Sik Yuen to distribute moon cakes to elderlies on 3 September 2016 to show our respect and caring to them.

5. **The Brigade Long Service Medals Presentation Ceremony 2016** was held on Sunday, 13 November 2016 at Pui Ching Primary School. There were 309 recipients including Brigade Officers/Presidents/Surgeons/Members and over 150 recipients attended. Over 150 guests including St. John Personnel and guests were invited by both the Brigade and the Medal Recipients attended the Ceremony.



6. In order to develop the St. John team spirit and promote physical health among Cadet Members, Cadets' Touch Rugby Competition was held on Monday, 26 December 2016 at King's Park Sports Ground. There was a total of 336 Officers and Cadets joining the event.



7. Publicity in various Local Media

- The **Hong Kong Medical Journal** interviewed the Association Director, Dr. Chung Chin-hung on emergency care training in August 2016.
- The Association participated in media interview in **Hong Kong Cable Television Limited** television programme 《至FIT男女》-「醫療頭條」 in regard to the symptoms and treatment of heat stroke and heat exhaustion.
- The Association was invited to introduce first aid skills and knowledge on home safety for elderly for a TVB programme 《耆趣fun天地》. The programme was broadcasted from 21 November to 2 December 2016 in 11 series.
- The Association was invited by 《我的事務所》 of **Metro Finance** for interviews regarding first aid on 20 and 21 December 2016, 14 January 2017 and 22 February 2017 with 8 episodes. The broadcast period was from 5 January 2017 to 28 February 2017, every Thursday from 2100 to 2130 hours.

8. **A Family Fun Day** was held on Sunday, 26 February 2017 at Tuen Mun Civic Square. The Opening Ceremony was officiated by Professor Sophia Chan Siu-chee, JP, Under Secretary for Food and Health.

The event aimed to deliver health message to public, as well as to foster loving family relationship in the community. A series of activities had been held by St. John members and supporting parties, including parent-child competition, stage performances, first aid demonstration, medical check-up services, game booths, ambulance and equipment display etc. There were over 3,500 participants joined the event.

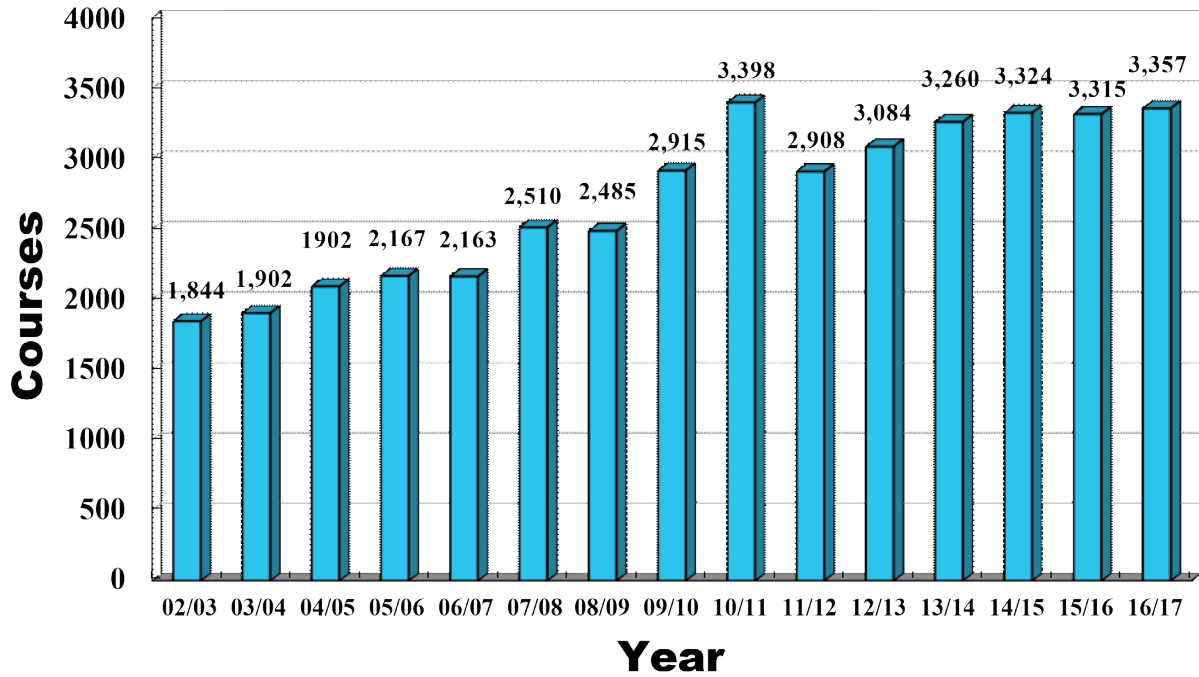

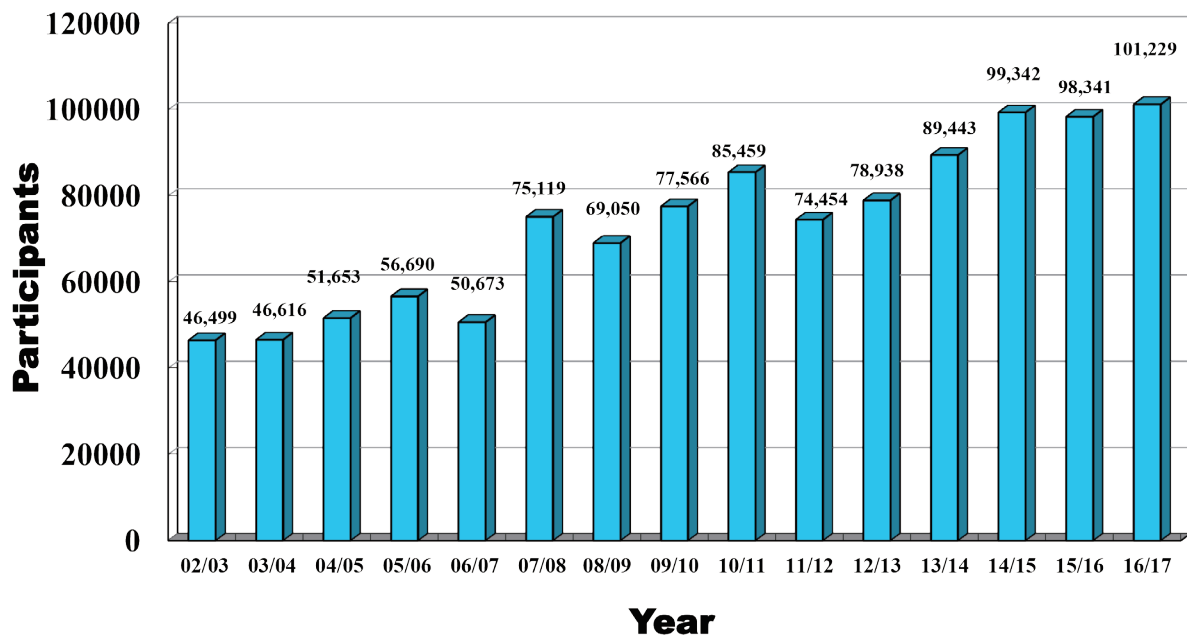


Service Statistics

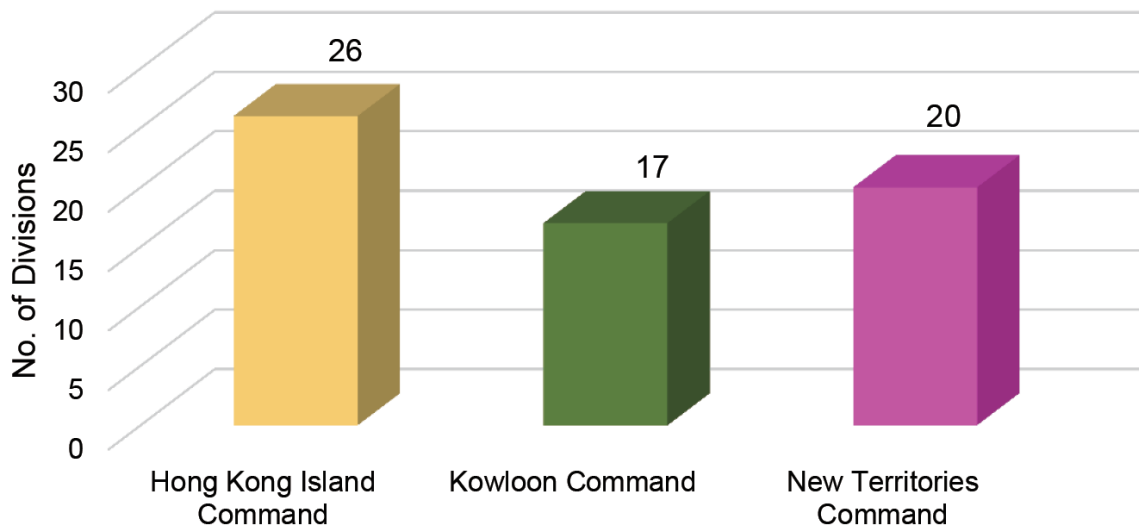

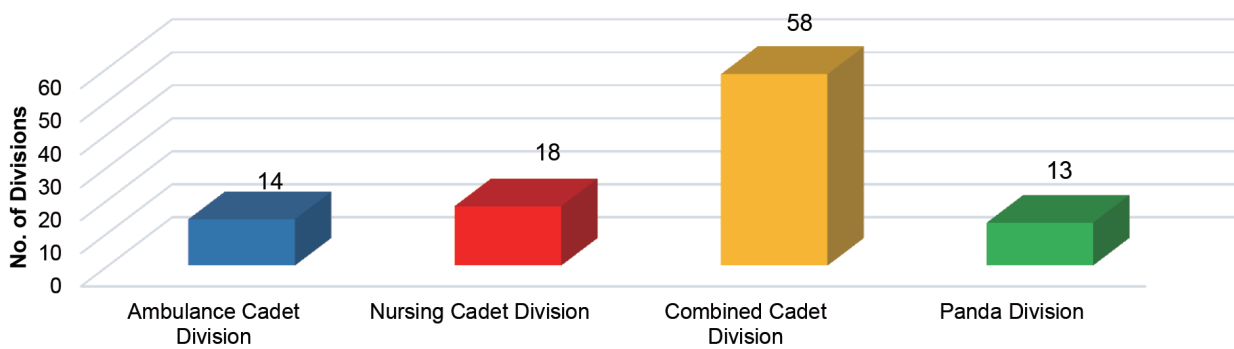

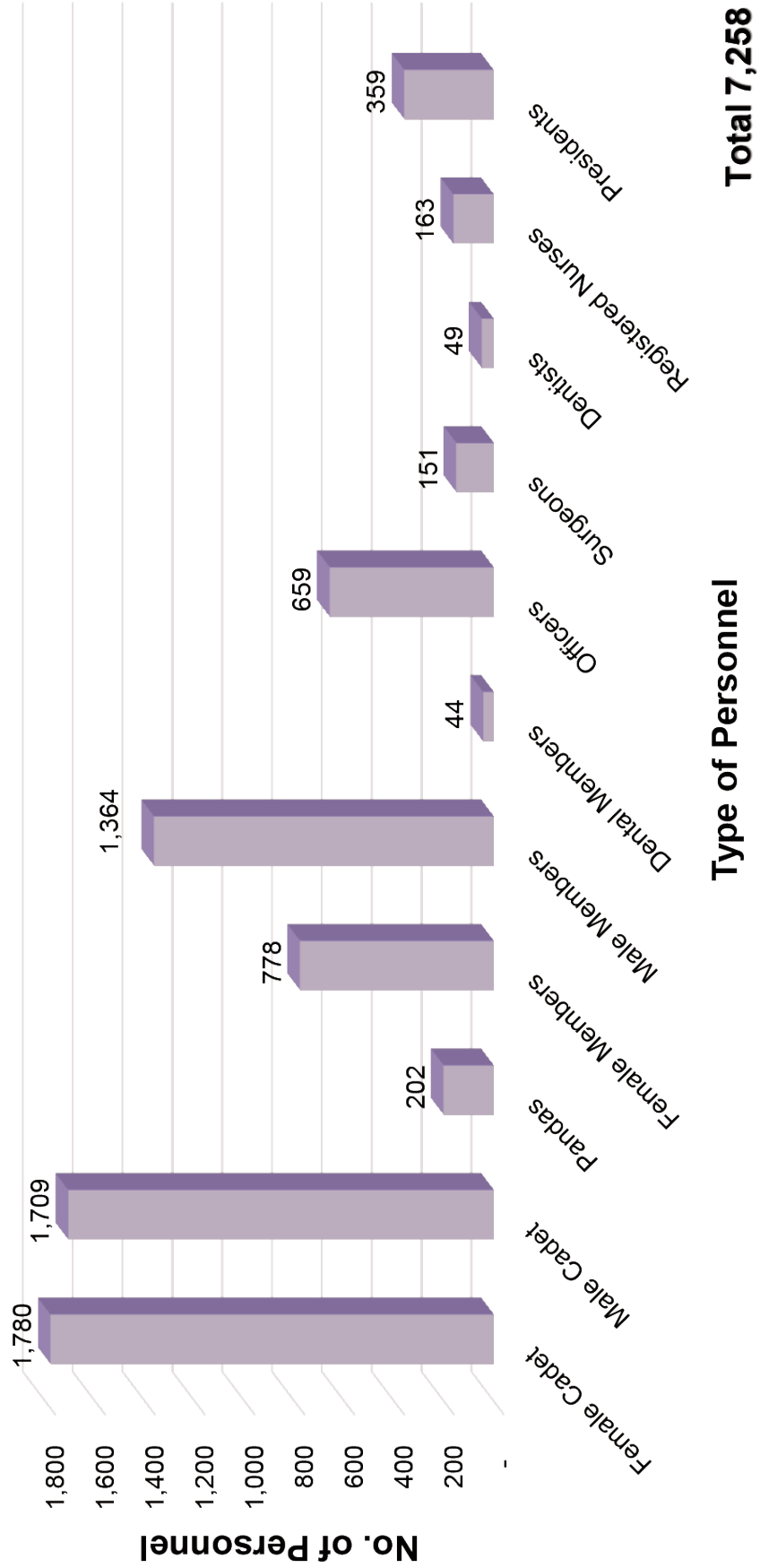
Number of Divisions in the Hong Kong Island / Kowloon / New Territories Command



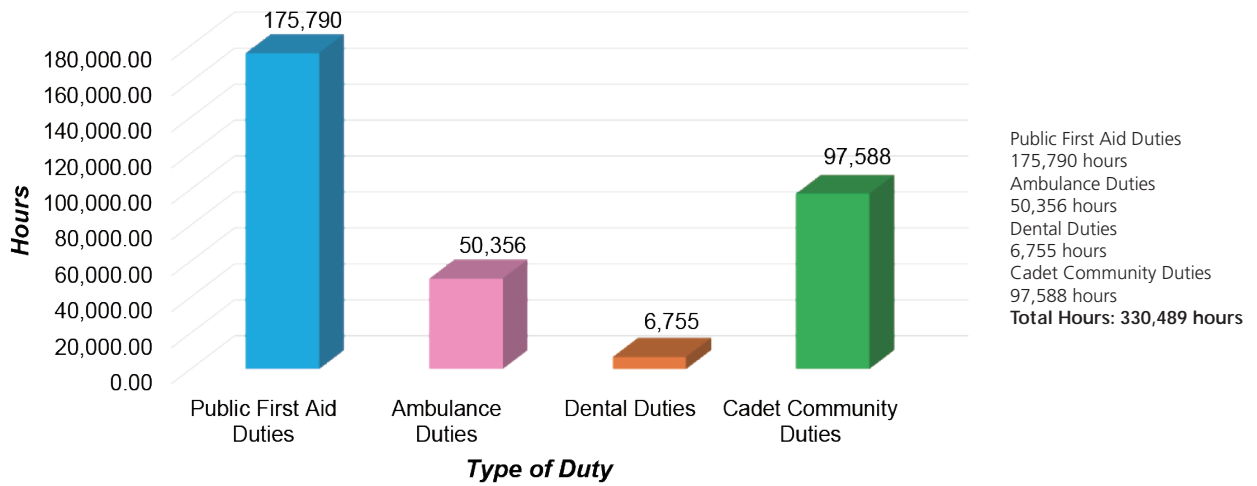
Number of Divisions in the Youth Command



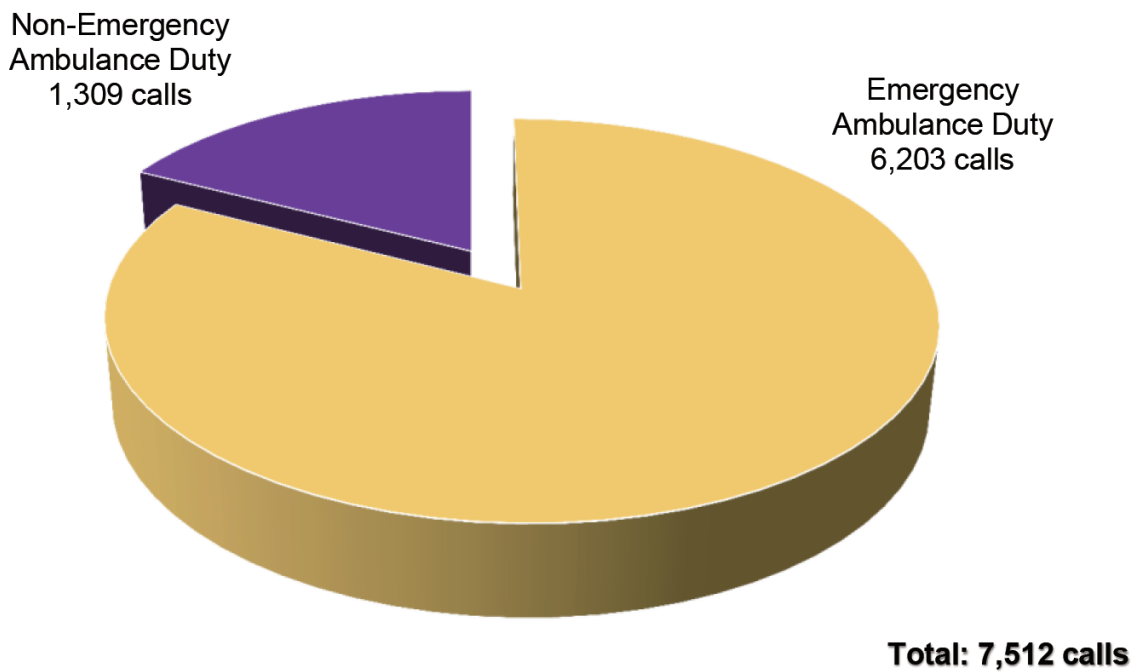
Strength of the Brigade as at 31 March 2017
